


September's Learner Profile Focus: Respect

This month at GSIS, our learner profile focus was Respect. We have been showcasing this value in various ways, including:


- 1. Highlighting the importance of respect during the morning assembly.

Science & Music collaboration in Grade 4





Inspired by our school's vision of raising progressive and personalized learning to empower generations as impactful and productive global citizens, the Science and Music departments collaborated joyfully. They conducted a scientific experiment related to the 4th-grade curriculum's energy transfer unit, specifically focusing on sound waves.

Ms. Natalie began the lesson with a well-prepared presentation, introducing the concept of sound transfer through vibrations and how these vibrations are perceived as sound waves by the ear. Following this, Ms. Dima played the trombone against coffee granules to demonstrate the transfer of sound waves. The live activity allowed students to witness how the soundwaves caused the coffee bits to vibrate, thus illustrating the effect of soundwaves.

This experiment proved to be both fascinating and beneficial for the students. It helped them establish connections between theories and real-life experiences, enhancing their understanding of the subject matter




SADAFCO VISIT


